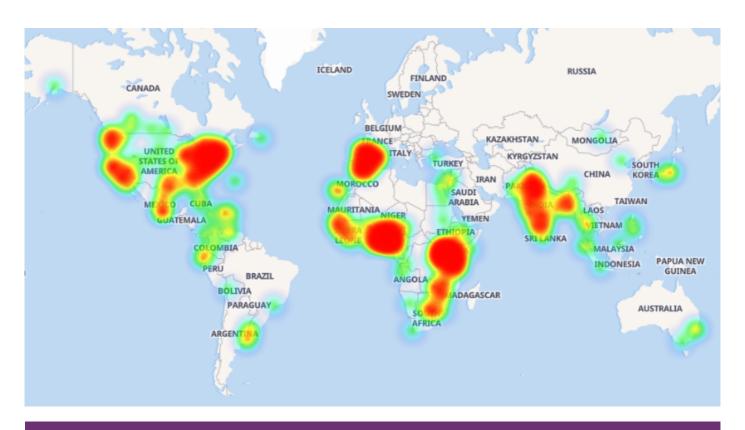

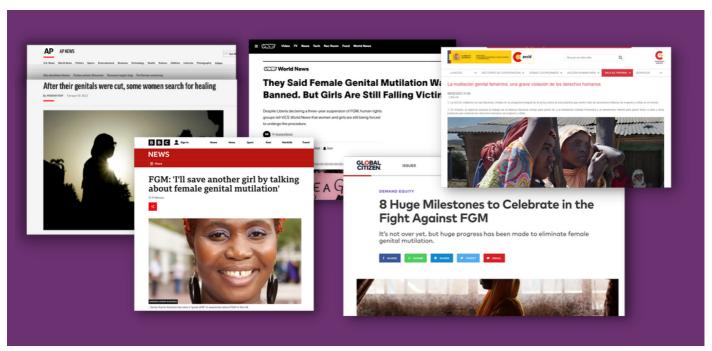

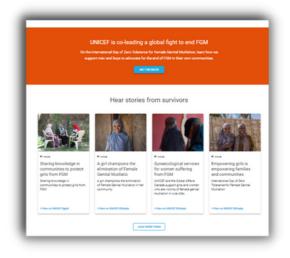

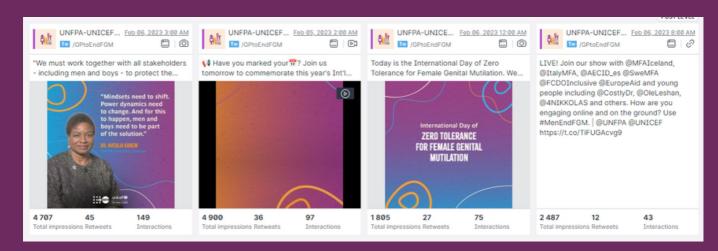

## Live Event in Uganda UNFPA and UNICEF

On 8 February 2023, UNFPA and UNICEF Uganda launched phase IV of the Joint Program on Elimination of FGM.

Stakeholders from the Government, civil society, grassroots, and other key organizations committed to implementing the new phase in close collaboration with UNFPA and UNICEF, including a focus on engagement with men and boys,













## Ending FGM in Guinea-Bissau UNFPA and UNICEF

On 24 February 2023, The Ministry of Women, together with UNFPA and UNICEF organized a roundtable event to discuss the issue of FGM in Guinea Bissau, with the aim to reflect with stakeholders on the results achieved and outline strategies that can accelerate the end of this practice.

A march, with around 300 participants from different institutions, also took place and was organized to call on decision-makers and society, in general, to urge all actors to commit themselves to ending this practice.







## Launching the Saleema caravan UNICEF Sudan

On 6 February 2023, more than 200 girls at Al-fayha Basic School for girls in Khartoum joined UNICEF, partners, parents, teachers, and donors to celebrate the International Day of Zero Tolerance for FGM.

At the event, the 'Saleema caravan' was launched, that will traverse communities sharing messages on the benefits of keeping girls Saleema through awareness-raising sessions, in and out-of-school youth dialogues, and theatrical performances via the interactive theatre groups.

The Saleema champions that spoke on behalf of the many other girls in Sudan called on fathers, brothers, uncles and grandparents students, teachers, child rights organizations, in Sudan and across the world to protect girls from FGM as well as address negative social norms that affect them.







## Community Even in South Sudan UNFPA South Sudan

On 6 February 2023, UNFPA South Sudan in partnership with Alight held a community activity in celebration of the International Day of Zero Tolerance for FGM in Doka Community in Eastern Gallabat locality in Gedaref. The activity mobilized youth, especially young men, to raise their community's awareness about the harms of FGM and the role of men and boys in sharing knowledge and information to support the social norms transformation around FGM and child marriage. The activity included speeches by representatives from the local governorate, Doka locality, CVAW, MOH, Gedaref Council of Child Welfare, the social development sector in DOKA, Doka and Community leaders, drama performed by YPeers, traditional dance and trivia on FGM with awards.

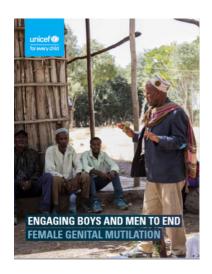
