12 June 2023 (0800-1030 New York)

Objectives

The Objectives of the 2023 WASH Annual Global Partners meeting are as follows:

- Share and jointly review progress on 2022 Global Annual Results Report,
- Share updates on the Strategic Plan 2022-2025 WASH Programme Results framework, Baseline, Milestones and Targets as well as the programming approaches planned to achieve these results
- Interact on key WASH programming issues including climate, gender and systems strengthening
- Provide an update on UNICEF's humanitarian WASH response and programming in fragile contexts
- Examine how the UNICEF WASH approach synergizes with partners strategies and how can we work together to achieve these results / to deliver on these synergies for WASH Sector outcomes

Meeting Format and Agenda

This year's 2023 WASH Annual Global Partners meeting is scheduled for 12 June 2023. The online meeting will last 2.5 hours.

Each session will start with a brief introduction of the context, followed by facilitated exchanges between participants. Expected Outcomes

Overall, the exchanges will be an opportunity for reviewing and reflecting on the scale and type of results that UNICEF WASH programmes are delivering greater and consult with partners on how to adapt UNICEF's programming to contribute to rebuilding and longer-term "reimagining" of equitable, sustainable and resilient WASH services in the current global complex and evolving context. Specific outcomes are as follows:

- Sharing of our global results to support UNICEF WASH programming approaches, future i) planned results and funding needs
- ii) Enhancing quality and coherence of the strategic direction of UNICEF's WASH Programming
- iii) Sharing of synergies and learning on the latest available evidence and strategic directions for UNICEF WASH programming at all levels
- iv) better understanding of how our joint partnerships can together accelerate progress towards SDG targets 6.1 and 6.2 and linkages with other key sectors and to increase impact
