COMMITMENT


Ensure that affected children and families participate in the decisions that affect their lives, are properly informed and consulted, and have their views acted upon

BENCHMARKS (how do we monitor this commitment?)

All COs establish processes to ensure that affected and at-risk populations:

- 1. Participate in humanitarian planning and in decisions that affect their lives
- 2. Are informed about their rights and entitlements, services, and expected standards of conduct by UNICEF personnel, through their preferred language and methods of communication
- 3. Have access to safe and confidential complaint mechanisms
- 4. Have their **feedback systematically collected** and used to inform programme design and course correction




CO programmes undertake activities for AAP capacity development of staff, government and partners











AAP Agora training is mandatory for all country staff

AAP MAPPING TOOL

Key steps recommended for developing AAP strategies/action plans

- 1. Be sure your **CO** has defined an AAP governance structure for the country office and outlined roles and responsibility for each category of staff to implement AAP within their programme (sectoral and cross-sectoral) and operational accountabilities
- 2. Review the AAP CO's information registered in the <u>AAP dashboard</u>. 1) This tool will help to know the status of AAP in each COs about the AAP global objectives and CSI H8 2.e. and keep in mind the AAP gaps.
- **3. Complete the AAP mapping tool.** if there is enough time, conduct a "quick and dirty" mapping of AAP activities in the CO, and base your strategy on what is already happening if you have less time, and in times of humanitarian crisis, conduct bilateral calls with programs and divisions and get quick information that can inform your strategy"
- 4. Analyse the AAP CO's information registered in the AAP Dashboard and mapped AAP activities: This step will help to Identify achievements, gaps, challenges, and opportunities across the AAP's Strategic Objectives (4) and 7 pillars of the UNICEF AAP framework
- 5. Complete the AAP strategy and action planning process
